ANNUAL **MEETING**

The difficulty we experienced in filling the previous Pastoral vacancies gave the Executive Board reason to examine the UCN By-Laws, specifically, Article VI: Alternating Denominational Leadership. It is the recommendation of the Executive Board, that we adopt the proposed change to Article VI. The purpose of this change is to make alternating the denomination of the pastor into a recommendation rather than a requirement, so the church can select the best minister available in the event of a

vacancy.

We will be voting on this change to the By-Laws at the Annual Meeting of the UCN Congregation on January 21, 2018.



BY-LAW AMENDMENT

Article VI currently reads:

ARTICLE VI ALTERNATING DENOMINATIONAL LEADERSHIP

There shall be alternating denominational ministerial leadership between the United Church of Christ and the United Methodist Church. In the event of a pastoral vacancy, both conferences shall be notified. The minister (s) shall be called or appointed according to the procedure of the denomination of the Vermont Conference of the United Church of Christ or that of the New England Conference of the United Methodist Church.

Proposed Change:

ARTICLE VI ALTERNATING

DENOMINATIONAL LEADERSHIP

In the event of a pastoral vacancy, both the Vermont Conference of the United Church of Christ and the New England Conference of the United Methodist Church shall be notified. The preference shall be that the denomination of the succeeding pastor shall be the alternate denomination of the vacating pastor. However, the United Church of Newport may, at the discretion of the Pastoral and **Staff Relations Committee** and Executive Committee. deviate from this pattern based on availability and desirability of possible successors from each denomination. There shall be no limit on successive pastors from a denomination other than the preference previously stated in this article shall be observed when any vacancy occurs. It shall also be the preference that in the event of co-pastors, they be of differing denominations, subject to the

same discretion of the

relevant committees.

Please keep this in mind, and plan to attend the meeting. A quorum of **30** people are needed to adopt any changes to the By-Laws.



REFORMATION 500

October marked the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther's 95 Theses, a document that launched the Protestant Reformation and the flowering of theological debate, which has given us the incredible variety of churches we see today. In accordance with the call of faith leaders around the

world, including Pope Francis, we marked the anniversary with a joint celebration with St Mark's Episcopal Church. With more than 80 UCN members in attendance, 40 from St Mark's, and around 10 other guests joining us for the occasion, it was a memorable and vibrant service featuring a joint choir, and joint communion celebrated by James and Rev Christine Moseley. We hope that this celebration is just the beginning of an ever closer friendship with our brothers and sisters of faith across the community.

Stay tuned for more events to celebrate the ongoing Reformation Year including the return of the traditional Community Palm Sunday Celebration.



As part of our ongoing Reformation 500 Year, plans are underway to have the month of February as an ecumenical celebration of environmental stewardship. The hope is for the month to include speakers on the biblical imperatives and spiritual aspects of caring for our land, water, and air both locally and on a global level. Partnering with the Memphremagog Watershed Association and other area churches we will have the chance to learn, share, and fellowship with one-another as we share in God's creation. A winter ski trip is also a possibility, as the beauty of our world does not hibernate in in these winter months. Join us in person or in spirit as we explore this profound stewardship responsibility.

Lutheran Disaster Response. After some research, it was found to be one of the few organizations that was sending relief directly to Puerto Rico at that time. The other bonus to the Lutheran Disaster Response is that all money donated to them from the time of the hurricanes until Dec 30, 2017 would be doubled by Thrivent Finance and In Faith Community Foundation, a national charity with a mission to serve donors spread joy and change lives through charitable giving. So instead of sending \$676 to Puerto Rico, we sent \$1,352. THANK YOU!!!







There is one Christmas Carol that has always baffled me. What in the world do leaping lords, French hens, swimming swans, and especially the partridge who won't come out of the pear tree have to do with Christmas?

From 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Someone during that era wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning: the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of their church. Each element in the carol has a code word for a religious reality which the children could remember.













-The four calling birds were the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke & John.



-The six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation.








-The <u>eleven</u> pipers piping stood for the <u>eleven</u> faithful disciples.





















