May God continue to guide and bless the wider Methodist church.


UCC General Synod~~

At the Executive Board meeting on Wednesday, June 9th, we voted to hire Denise Piette as our new Treasurer to replace Janet Wiseman, who is leaving the area. Denise will officially start in August and will work with Janet, Jenna, and the financial secretary to ensure a smooth hand off. Denise was the Treasurer/ Bookkeeper in the past.

Right now she and her husband own "The Front Desk" store on East Main Street in Newport.

The Executive Board accepts the recommendation from the Building & Grounds committee to use Gray's paving to complete the parking lot paving project We will not meet in July and August and will resume regular meetings in

September.

Food Shelf~~

throughout the pandemic by keeping all the recipients in the church parking lot. They have been kept 6 feet apart while wearing a mask and receive their bag of food through a window in the Youth Room. They are asked for their choice of frozen meat- such as spiral cut ham, hot dogs, beef cuts, ground beef, bacon, chicken, etc. They are also given butter when available. Each person receives one bag of food and if there are four or more people in the household, they are given 2 bags. We have also put four tables in the parking lot for a large variety of "Free Choice" items such as breads and pastries from Shaw's, juices, eggs, different canned goods, and sometimes toiletries! We also have fresh produce when available. The number of food bags distributed per month has varied from 150 to 184.

Fortunately we have been able to

continue operations of the Food Shelf

Beginning in July (pass out days 5th, 6th, and 7th) we will resume the distribution of food bags indoors in the Fellowship Hall. Recipients will enter via the Third Street door and exit via the parking lot door. We will also have tables for the "Free Choice" items. Once a year recipients are required to complete and sign the "statement of Eligibility to receive USDA Foods" form. and we will do this on July 5th, 6th, & 7th.

Everyone Eats— Free to-go Meals~~

This has been a very successful program since last September but we expect it to conclude on June 28th. Like the Food Shel-

- all recipients have remained in the parking lot and received their meals

through the window. We operated every Monday and Friday from 10:30AM- Noon Monday meals have come from Lagos (we would receive 100 meals from them) and Fridays meals came from Newport Natural Market & Café (we would receive 150-200 meals from them) and Vermont Pie & Pasta would give us an extra 50 meals every Friday. A BIG Thank you to Bettie Souliere, Judy Hurd and Merle Chilcott for being an amazing crew helping hand out meals and also a thank you to those others who came to help on occasions!

UCN Bell Choir~~

The UCN Bell Choir 'Bottles for Bells fundraiser' earned \$91.10 since January 2021! Thank you so much for supporting this fundraiser by donating your returnable bottles and cans. Those nickels add up! The bell choir uses these funds to purchase new music and keep our annual membership active with Handbell



Musicians of America.

The membership with the national Handbell Musicians of America (HMA) includes the more local; Area 1 New England Group, and Vermont Handbell Association. Any member of our ensemble to try it out! may attend festivals, conferences, spring rings, and national seminars at a discounted membership rate. We receive a subscription to a quarterly print magazine called 'Overtones' with articles on tips and tools, techniques, handbell events around the nation, and how HMA continues to follow their mission of uniting people through a musical art. We hope more church family members will be interested in learning more about making music with handbells.

The Vermont Spring Ring was cancelled for the second year because of the pandemic. We are hopeful Vermont Spring Ring 2022 will be held in the Northeast Kingdom. Ruth Marquette, UCN Bell Choir director, virtually attended the Area 1 Ringers Reunion in May. This was the first time Area 1 offered this virtual ringing opportunity and Ruth was glad to get the chance to ring along with a rehearsal choir. Ruth will virtually attend the National Seminar for four days in mid-July, too. Hello Church Family,

My name is Mary Hoadley, you may know me as a member at UCN, or from one of my many virtual sermons presented over the past year. I am also working towards ordination with the United Church of Newport.

I am pleased to announce that I just finished my Pastoral Ministry Education training. This 6-month course was an alternative to a traditional Clinical Pastoral Education program and fulfills my ordination requirements. For 6 months we worked with cohort made up of others seeking this ordination requirement, our advisor Rev. Alyssa May and Leanne Tigert, DMIV and Christian counselor. Throughout the program, which was about 40 hours per month, we had various assignments in reading/writing. didactic opportunities with skilled professionals, group processing, individual supervision along with other ministry work that we used to be a springboard for reflection and written assignments. This program was rooted in learning about self-care, congregational care/leadership, hospice/end of life care, trauma sensitive care, new and emerging ministries, mental health, addiction, and spirituality. Along with other topics, scenarios, and case studies.

Therefore, it is with great joy that I share my last step towards seeking ordination is my ordination paper. I will present this to the VT UCC Ministerial


